Come Home to the Catholic Church

Through Mary's example others come to believe

As we begin Ordinary Time in this new liturgical year, the Gospel story of the Wedding Feast at Cana (John 12:1-11) is anything but ordinary! Today we hear the story of Jesus' first miracle and are also reminded of Mary's extraordinary faith. Mary's life has always provided for us a model of how to live and to love. Through her faith in Jesus "his disciples began to believe in him."

It is possible that we can follow Mary's example and help others to believe in Jesus? What a great question to ask yourself during the **Catholics Come Home** evangelization initiative. All of us know someone who has been away from the church and in some families this is a cause for concern and sadness. Consider the following ways to bring others back to the Church:

- First of all, follow Mary's lead and be a good example: attend Mass, celebrate the Sacraments regularly and live by Jesus' commandment to love God and love others in your everyday life.
- Talk about your faith in positive ways. Let people know the
 joy and strength you receive form your faith in God. With the
 ads on TV it is so easy to begin a conversation on faith, just
 ask, "What do you think about those Catholic Come Home ads
 on TV?"
- Be Proud of your Catholic faith. Find ways to learn and grow in understanding of our history and the teachings of the Church. Participate in adult formation in your parish and share all that you learn with others.
- Finally, **Pray** for your friends and family members that have distanced themselves from the Church.


