Words of Welcome

The influence of family members and friends can be a key element in someone's decision to return to the church. It might be the example of a spouse

who comes home from Mass with a renewed spirit. Sometimes, it's the question of a child. Or it could be an invitation or encouragement from a friend, co-worker or neighbor.

Last weekend we were asked to pray for five people we know who have fallen away from the practice of our faith. Here are some examples of what we can say to them:

For people who have been away for a long time: "Have you ever thought about coming back to the Catholic Church? If you're interested, I'd like to invite you to come with me to my parish."

For people who drifted away: "I'd love to have you come with me for Mass or some parish event. I'd like for you to see what kind of things my parish is doing and meet some of the great people."

For people who are angry at the Church: "I know you had a bad experience with the Church. But my parish is wonderful, and I thought you might want to take another look. You could come to Mass with me. Or I could introduce you to someone at the parish that you could talk with."

For people who are angry at God: "It might sound strange, but it's OK to be angry at God. The best way to deal with anger it to talk to someone about it. I can set up a meeting with someone from my parish if you're interested."

For people who think the Catholic Church doesn't want them: "I know you feel as if the Church rejected you, but it might be a good idea to talk with someone who can help you to unravel some of the issues that make you feel separated from the Church."


