*New Words.
Deeper Meaning.

The book that the priest prays from is called the Roman Missal. The one we currently use is the Latin Roman Missal from the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). The missal contains all of the prayers of the Mass in their official Latin version. The Roman Missal, like every liturgical book used in the Catholic Church, was first published entirely in Latin. The Second Vatican Council maintained the Church's preference for the Latin language, but was also open to a more extended use of the vernacular, the common language of the people. The results of this have been overwhelmingly positive. This has helped people to pray with more understanding and to deepen spiritual connections between the liturgy and their everyday life.

While the church allowed for the use of the vernacular language (focus, English), the prayers themselves still needed to be translated from the original Latin to English. As we began the new millennium, Pope John Paul II promulgated a third edition of the missal. We currently use the second edition of the missal from 1985. New guidelines for translating the third edition came out in 2001. Work on translating the third edition of the missal from Latin into English began in 2002 and was completed and approved on April 30, 2010. All of the eleven English-speaking countries will pray from the third edition of the Roman Missal beginning Nov. 27, 2011, the first Sunday of Advent.

What will the revision in the new missal look like? We will discover that the prayer (especially the one after communion) will end on a strong note. The vocabulary will have more variety of words and phrases coming from the Old and New Testaments of the Bible and the saints. The prayers will be more concrete and poetic, and the phrases of the prayers will be more faithful to the Latin language. The tone will be more reverent, noble and sacred. But the language of the Mass is more than just words. It is something we enter into. It speaks through the mind, body and soul, through sacrament and symbol, through all of our senses. To fully participate in the Mass, we need to be able to speak the language of the Mass in its many forms. The third edition of the revised missal hopes to accomplish this.

2011 Archdiocesan Annual Catholic Appeal Begins Next Week!

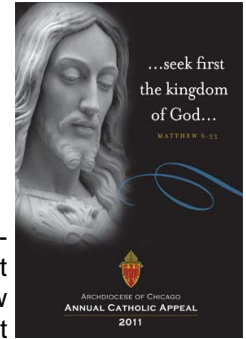
Please Respond Generously to Cardinal George's Letter

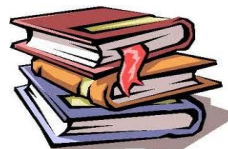
