RCIA UPDATE: The Scrutinies

Our elect, Cynthia Bahorich and Briana Martin begin their final stage of preparation in a special series (three) of Lenten prayers called the scrutinies this weekend. These prayers uncover and heal what is weak and sinful in their life and strengthen what is strong and good in their life.

The scrutinies also include an exorcism. Why? Underlying the exorcism is the assumption that baptism makes a difference in our life. After we are baptized, we have the gift of God's grace every day of our life. The Holy Spirit helps us make good decisions based on the Christian life we share.

Life is different for the unbaptized. They have not enjoyed the benefits of God's grace as we have. The baptized who sin seek forgiveness. The unbaptized who sin receive an exorcism. Remember, exorcisms were a part of Jesus' ministry.

The prayers that are prayed over the elect sum up why this period of final preparation for the sacraments of initiation is called purification and enlightenment. They purify Briana and Cynthia from what is evil in their life and enlighten what is good.

Continue to pray for our elect, Cynthia and Briana and their godparents Emily Powell and Lisa Hernandez. The scrutinies continue next weekend with the Fourth Sunday of Lent and conclude on the Fifth Sunday of Lent.

FIGHT FOCA POSTCARD CAMPAIGN

POST CARD SIGNING DAY! Next week our parish will join Catholics across the country in sending a message to Congress: Please oppose the "Freedom of Choice Act" (FOCA) and retain laws against government funding and promotion of abortion. You will have the opportunity to sign postcards to your U.S. Representative and two U.S. Senators. Please plan to participate in this important event. The text of the postcard is as follows:

At this time of serious national challenge, Americans should unite to serve the good of all, born and unborn. The Freedom of Choice Act (FOCA), the most radical and divisive pro-abortion bill ever introduced in Congress, would create a "fundamental right" to abortion that government could not limit but would have to support. FOCA would overturn many existing widely-supported policies, including laws protecting parental involvement and conscience rights and those preventing partial-birth abortions and taxpayer funding of abortion.

Please oppose FOCA or any similar measure and retain existing laws against funding and promotion of abortion. As your constituent, I would appreciate a response telling me how you would vote in these matters.

These postcards come from the National Conference of Catholic Bishops and are meant to express our concern as citizens about a law that would go beyond Roe v. Wade, the 1973 Supreme Court decision allowing abortion, and would invalidate laws on things like informed consent, parental involvement, physician licensure, clinic safety, and taxpayer funding. FOCA also threatens to remove language that protects physicians and hospital personnel from doing something that violates their own conscience and moral principles. I invite you next weekend to join me in signing these postcards on this important issue.
