#### **Church Regulations Regarding Fast & Abstinence**

**Fasting:** All the faithful in good health from ages 18 to 59 years fast on Good Friday by limiting themselves to one full meal. On such fasting days, they may also take two smaller meals, but nothing between meals.

**Abstinence:** Catholics aged 14 and older abstain from meat on Good Friday and on all the Fridays of Lent.

"(On) weekdays of Lent, we strongly recommend participation in daily Mass and self-imposed observances of fasting. In light of grave human needs which weigh on the Christian conscience in all seasons, we urge particularly during Lent, generosity, to local, national and world programs of sharing of all things needed to translate our duty to penance into a means of implementing the right of the poor to their part of our abundance," (U.S. Bishops statement of penitential observances, 1966.)
