# WORD AT A TIME Break

Because they are small or quick, some gestures in the Mass can easily escape our notice. One such action is the breaking of the host during the singing or recitation of the "Lamb of God." Breaking the bread or the host carries deep meaning. The gesture goes back to Jesus, as the words of consecration in the Mass tell us, "... he said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his disciples ..." In the early Church, the whole celebration of the Eucharist was often simply called "the Breaking of Bread."

The breaking of bread symbolizes the suffering body of Christ broken for us. The breaking of the one bread to feed many symbolizes our unity in Christ. The breaking of bread for later distribution to the sick symbolizes our union with those who cannot be with us in the Mass.

When the two disciples who were going to Emmaus returned to Jerusalem, they told the apostles how they had recognized Jesus in the breaking of bread. Even today, in this small gesture, we recognize his presence among us.

# WORD AT A TIME Powtw

Porque son breves y rápidos, algunos gestos en la Misa pueden fácilmente pasar desapercibidos. Una acción tal es la partición de la hostia durante el canto o la recitación del "Cordero de Dios." Partir el pan o la hostia tiene un profundo significado. El gesto va hasta Jesús, en cuanto que las mismas palabras de la consagración durante la Misa nos dicen, "... tomó pan, dándote gracias, lo partió y lo dio a sus discípulos ..." En la Iglesia primitiva, la entera celebración de la Eucaristía era llamada simplemente "Fracción del Pan." Con eso está dicho todo.

La fracción del pan simboliza el sufrimiento del cuerpo de Cristo 'roto' por nosotros. La partición del único pan para alimento de muchos, simboliza nuestra unidad en Cristo. La fracción del pan, para su posterior distribución a los enfermos, simboliza nuestra unión con aquellos que no pueden estar con nosotros en la Misa.

Cuando los dos discípulos del Camino a Emaús retornaron a Jerusalén contaron a los apóstoles cómo habían reconocido a Jesús al partir el pan. Todavía hoy, en este breve gesto, reconocemos su presencia entre nosotros.
