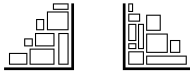

A LOOK AT TODAY'S PARISH

Four Things that Hurt Parishes



Before we look at the negative, let's recall the positive: the four marks of the Church. In the earliest professions of faith, the Catholic Church always identified herself as "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic." We pray these words in the Nicene Creed professed at Sunday Mass. Inseparably linked with one another, these four marks indicate the essential features of the Church and her mission on earth. Let's take a quick look at each one of them.

The Church is ONE. She professes "one Lord, one faith, one baptism" (Eph 4:5). This unity, sustained by the Holy Spirit, includes a diversity of gifts, talents, cultures, and rites.

The Church is HOLY. Jesus, the founder, is holy and makes his holiness available through his death and Resurrection. The Holy Spirit imparts holiness to us, especially through the Sacraments. The Church's holiness shines in the saints, and most especially in the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Church is CATHOLIC. The word *catholic* means universal. All the means of salvation are found in the Church. The Church has the fullness of the faith, the Sacraments, and apostolic succession.

The Church is APOSTOLIC. Jesus willed to build the Church on the foundation of the Apostles. The Church hands on the teaching of the Apostles through all generations. Christ shepherds the Church through Peter and the other Apostles, whose successors are the Pope and the college of bishops.

As you can see these four marks of the Church insure its growth and development throughout history and the world. On a more human level, we can also be responsible for harming the church in four ways that are common to all parishes. Here are the four things the hurt parishes:

- NEGATIVITY - It can begin with a few disgruntled people, but it can spread like wildfire. The best way to deal with negativity is to address it head-on. Is what this person or group saying true? If yes, what needs to be done? If no, the person or group must be confronted and the negativity exposed.
- GOSSIP - Gossip is negativity directed at a person or group. One's own insecurity is the source of this problem. The best way to deal with this is, once again, to approach it directly.
- CLIQUES - Sadly, people involved in one usually do not think of themselves as "cliquish". They've been running things for so long they automatically rely on the same people over and over again. Sometimes a friendly reminder to invite others is a good start. Newcomers also benefit and help the parish by starting new ministries. This was evidenced at the last session of "New Beginnings" last fall.
- REFUSAL TO CHANGE - Tradition is good, but when things become too rigid, "this is the way things have always been done," a parish can quickly begin to decline. Change is never easy, regardless of age or experience; but talking about it will help. It is always good to find a balance that will maintain some time-honored traditions, while incorporating new ways of doing things and involving new people in doing them.

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On Saturday of this week the Church celebrates the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On this day we commemorate the bodily entry of Mary into heaven. This belief was declared as dogma of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1950.

Mary, as the first disciple of the Lord, the one who's great yes opened the doors of salvation to the world, has always been held as a model of the Church. As a model of discipleship and faith, her surrender to God's will gives us a pattern for our own lives of faith. As a model of the Church, her life gives us hope in the future promise of glory given to us at our Baptism.

The preface to the Eucharistic Prayer for today's Mass reminds us that Mary was "taken up into heaven to be the beginning and the pattern of the Church in its perfection." In other words, Mary's Assumption is our destiny as faithful followers of her Son! As disciples of Christ and as members of his Body the Church, we have a place at the heavenly banquet at the end of time when Christ returns to establish completely the kingdom of God. This is what is meant by saying that Mary is the image of the perfected Church—all the faithful, gathered from every time, nation, language, and way of life, forever gathered around the table of the Lamb, singing that hymn of endless life and praise!
