September 19th, 2009 at 4:00 PM**

On Saturday, September 19th, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick at the 4:00 P.M. Liturgy. This sacrament reminds us that the whole Church is praying for her members who are sick and that we are not alone in our suffering. There are others who suffer with us and there is our faith community to support, love and encourage us during our suffering.

Any of our faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age may be anointed. Also included are those who are:

1. Now seriously ill
2. Temporarily ill or convalescing
3. Chronically ill
4. Emotionally troubled
5. Elderly, even if no serious illness is present
6. Preparing for surgery in the near future
