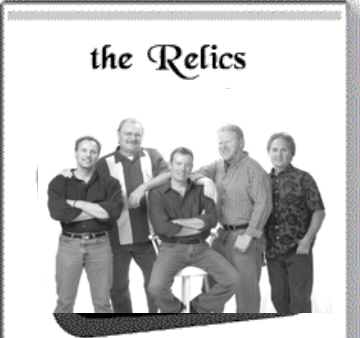

Communal Anointing of the Sick September 19th, 2009 at 4:00 PM

On Saturday, September 19th, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick at the 4:00 P.M. Liturgy. This sacrament reminds us that the whole Church is praying for her members who are sick and that we are not alone in our suffering. There are others who suffer with us and there is our faith community to support, love and encourage us during our suffering.

Any of our faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age may be anointed. Also included are those who are:

1. Now seriously ill
2. Temporarily ill or convalescing
3. Chronically ill
4. Emotionally troubled
5. Elderly, even if no serious illness is present
6. Preparing for surgery in the near future

Since this is a parish celebration all are welcomed to attend and participate.

Exaltation of the Holy Cross Monday, September 14



We should glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, for he is our salvation, our life and our resurrection; through him we are saved and made free.

- Entrance Antiphon Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, *Roman Missal*

This Monday the Church celebrates the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. This day actually commemorates the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem.

The focus of the feast might best be seen through the lens of the antiphon, quoted above. Interestingly, this is also the antiphon with which the Church begins the great celebration of the Triduum, the three-day commemoration of Christ's Passion, death, and Resurrection on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

This can give us a clue as to how we should regard the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross: Through the cross of Jesus Christ we have been saved! For those of us who believe, the cross is much more than a sign of the means by which Christ died. It is a profound symbol of our Christian faith, one that encompasses and presents the heart of our faith: Christ's Paschal Mystery. Through the instrument of torture and execution, we proclaim that God has brought life and salvation to the world.

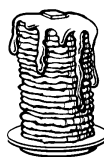
