**THE BEATIFICATION OF JOHN HENRY NEWMAN**

John Henry Newman was born on February 21, 1801. The eldest of six children, he was baptized and raised in the Church of England. He later attended Oxford University and was ordained an Anglican priest in 1825.

Over time, Newman was drawn to a more Roman Catholic understanding of his faith. He was received into the Roman Catholic Church on October 10, 1845, and was ordained to the Roman Catholic priesthood on June 1, 1847. He helped create the Catholic University of Ireland and served as rector from 1854 to 1858. A brilliant writer and scholar, he led many souls to conversion. Pope Leo XIII named him a cardinal in 1879.

Cardinal Newman died on August 11, 1890. He was declared “Venerable” on June 22, 1991. He was given the title “Blessed” by Pope Benedict XVI at a beatification ceremony last Sunday while the Pope was in England.
