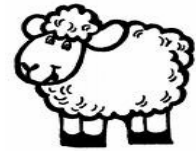
October 18th & 19th - Session 101 (Our Parish—Our History to Our Future)

How to welcome lost sheep back into the fold.



Set a good example.

Tips on inviting friends and family back to the Church: **Focus** on you own faith experience. Do you constantly criticize the Church? Or do you project a sense of joy, peace, love and enthusiasm?

Love the other person unconditionally. When the rich young man walked away, Jesus looked at him with love.

Invite them not only to Mass but also to parish work-shops, lectures, concerts, social events, Scripture study and even service projects.

Don't **nag**. It never works.

Stay Informed to make sure you have correct information when talking to someone who is away from the Church.

Help people who are thinking about returning to the Church find a parish where they feel comfortable. Sometimes, people who have been involved with Pentecostals do best in a charismatic parish. People who have been in fundamentalist churches may want a parish with Scripture study. Some like the anonymity of a large suburban parish. Some seek the intimacy of a small parish. Some look for traditional liturgies or devotions. Others look for ways to work toward social justice.

Pray for the person.

Allow the **Holy Spirit** to work through you. Before long, you'll begin to see that people will be attracted to the Church because they want the faith, the love, and the peace you possess.

BLESSING OF THE ANIMALS Saturday, Oct. 4 at 12:30

Saint Francis of Assisi wrote a canticle of the creatures — an ode to God's living things and a testimony that animals share in Christ's love of all God's creation: "All praise to you, O Lord, for all these brother and sister creatures." All creatures, great and small — of the earth, sky and sea — O, praise God, the author and giver of every gift, who offered his own son to us as the paschal lamb.

Please be sure to bring your pets for a blessing (near the statue of St. Francis on the south side of the church).

A Blessing of Animals

This week, on Saturday, the Church celebrates the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi. Frances has long been identified as the patron saint of animals and of creation. Both the *Book of Blessings* (ch. 25) and *Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers* include an Order of Prayer for the Blessing of Animals on the feast of this great saint.

Our Catholic spiritual tradition has long held creation (the earth, all the animals and birds, the trees and plants, the mountains and hills), by its existence, gives praise to God, the great creator who entrusts his work into the hands of humans. Psalm 148, for example, sings, calling upon all creation to praise the Lord: "Praise him, sun and moon; / give praise, all shining stars; / You animals wild and tame, / you creatures that crawl and fly/.....let them all praise the Lord's name" (Psalm 148:3, 10, 13a).

Many parishes celebrate a blessing of animals in observance of the feast of Saint Francis. Such a prayer service begins with the sign of the cross and an introduction to the service of blessing. A reading of scripture follows (for example, the account of creation: Genesis 1:24-31). After that, the Prayer of Blessing is prayed, followed by Intercessions, the Lord's Prayer, and a Closing Prayer. The full order of service can be found in the *Book of Blessings* or in *Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers*, pp. 174-77.
