The Epiphany Proclamation 2014

It is ancient custom, from the centuries before popular, printed calendars, that on the day of Epiphany the date of Easter would be solemnly proclaimed. Thus the chant announcing Easter's date would be as follows:

My brothers and sisters, Today on the Solemnity of His Epiphany, the glory of the Lord has shone forth upon us, And it shall ever be manifest among His people, until the day of His glorious return. Within the measure of Nature's times and seasons, let us observe with celebration the

mysteries of faith.

Let us call to mind: The great and most holy Easter Triduum of Christ:

His passion and crucifixion,
His descent among the dead,
and His glorious rising,
celebrated from the night of Holy
Thursday—the 17th of April through the hours
of Good Friday—the 18th of April, in silence
on Holy Saturday—the 19th of April blooming
into the joy Easter Sunday—the 20th day of
April. Each Sunday will be as another Easter
Day, when the Holy Church presents anew the
great and saving deeds whereby Jesus has
conquered over sin and death.


