

The great and sad effect of Original Sin is that it separated us from God



and from each other. The great and wonderful grace of baptism is that it **unites** us with Christ and each other. Recall what Saint Paul says, "All of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death...For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." (Romans 6:3,5)

Baptism unites us to Christ, and that means that his destiny and ours are intertwined. If we want to see how our life will unfold or ought to unfold, we look to him. If we want to see the path that we must traverse, we watch the road that he traveled. Really, the key to our life is given to us in our Baptism. That key is our union with him who is our hope.
