An Orientation Meeting on How Do I Become Catholic

When is it?

A special evening has been set aside for anyone who has thought of becoming Catholic, but did not know how to go about doing it. It will take place this Thursday evening, October 9th at 7:00 PM in the rectory, 13145 S. Houston Ave.

Who is it for and what is it all about?

Besides those who are thinking about becoming Catholic, this meeting is also for those adult Catholics who may have not yet received the sacraments of Eucharist (1st Holy Communion) and/or Confirmation. During the meeting people who have gone through the process will offer their personal insights of becoming fully initiated into the Catholic faith. This process of becoming Catholic is known as the RCIA, short for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. We will explain in a step-by-step format how all of this takes place. Time for questions and answers will also be available. This meeting is meant to help any adult in his or her spiritual journey and how each one encounters the Lord through sacramental growth and maturity in the Church.
