Wait

We wait for Mass to begin. But do we wait during the Mass itself? If we hear Saint Paul correctly, the entire Mass is a waiting time. The Mass waits for and expects the second coming of Jesus. The Mass proclaims that in the death and resurrection of Jesus our redemption has begun to take hold of us, but we expect and await its completion when the Lord will come again in glory. Paul told the Corinthians: "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes."

We live in an in-between time, a waiting time before the Lord will come to bring all things together under his headship. In the meanwhile, especially at Mass, we wait and pray in our struggles with evil. After the Lord's Prayer we ask, "Deliver us, Lord, from every evil . . . as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ."

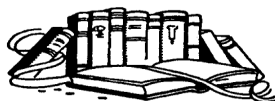
