- Advising the doubtful
- ♦ Comforting the sorrowful
- Bearing wrongs patiently
- Forgiving injuries
- Praying for the living and dead

As we grow in conformity to Christ, we see more clearly that all people are made in the image and likeness of God (see Gn 1:26) and so have an inherent value and dignity. By helping to build a more just and compassionate society, we act as Christ's Body in the world.
