Collect

The collect is the prayer that concludes the introductory rites of the Mass. The priest addresses the people, "Let us pray," signalling the purpose of the silence and the words that follow. Then he offers the prayer of the day, concluding with a formula to which everyone responds, "Amen."

The silence is important. During this time everyone is to "become aware of being in God's presence," so that they "may call to mind their intentions." Everyone prays "together with the Priest" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 54) – exercising the common priesthood of the baptized. If you have come to Mass with particular needs, this silence is the time to call them to mind.

As the priest offers the prayer, he is "collect-ing" the thoughts of the people, who themselves have been "collect-ed" together from their homes for this celebration at church. Although it is sometimes called the "opening prayer" of the Mass, it is more traditionally called the "collect."

The words express the character of the celebration. This is especially clear on occasions such as a wedding, a saint's day, and liturgical times such as Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. People attentive to the words of the collect will discover that the priest may be articulating the purpose of the event.

At other times the words are more generic. Many of these prayers were composed from the sixth to the eighth centuries. Some of them were written for particular liturgical days and are still being used on or near those days more than 1,000 years later.


The collect is addressed to God the Father, and it is offered through Jesus Christ in the unity of the Holy Spirit. The priest extends his hands while he prays, using a gesture popular in Christian prayer since the earliest times."

Year of Sacraments • One Word at a Time

Raise



When the priest celebrating the Anointing of the Sick anoints the hands of the sick person, he prays: “May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and **raise** you up.” These words echo the Letter of James: “The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up.” (James 5:15) There are no qualifications or conditions. The Letter of James says simply that the Lord will indeed raise them up.

What is this assured “raising up”? When we pray over a seriously ill loved one, we want them cured. We look for God to raise them up by restoring them to health and to us. But when God raises us up, he does not only restore us, he transforms us. Restoration may or may not be part of God’s action. What is absolutely certain is that in God’s hands the sick person is drawn into new life, God’s life.

Levantar



Durante la celebración de la Unción de los Enfermos, el sacerdote unge las manos de la persona enferma y reza: “Que el Señor que te libra de pecado te salve y te **levante**”. Estas palabras resuenan en la Carta de Santiago: “La oración hecha con fe sanará al enfermo y el Señor lo hará levantarse” (Santiago 5:15). No hay requisitos o condiciones. La Carta de Santiago dice simplemente que el Señor, en efecto, los levantará.

Pero, ¿qué es este “levantarse” que Dios nos garantiza? Cuando oramos por un ser querido gravemente enfermo, queremos que se sane. Buscamos a Dios para que lo levante haciendo que recupere su salud y que nosotros recuperemos a esta persona. Pero, cuando Dios nos levanta, no solo hace que nos recuperemos. Nos transforma. La recuperación puede ser o no parte de la obra de Dios. Lo que sí es absolutamente cierto es que, en las manos de Dios, la persona enferma pasa a vivir una vida nueva, la vida de Dios.
