Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Through the celebration of the eucharistic Liturgy, the Church throughout the world gives “thanks to God unceasingly.” The fruits of the Liturgy should likewise be “at work in (all) who believe.”

In the Gospel, Jesus warns about those who burden others without offering to assist. In the second reading, Paul highlights the care and gentleness with which he approached those to whom he was called. As the implementation of the revised Sacred Liturgy draws near, it is important to recognize the unease that some people may feel about the changes and gently help these people to accept the changes with an open heart and mind.

Embracing Change in the Liturgy

For many people, change does not come easy. Change requires us to stop doing things a certain way in order to do something else. Many people find comfort in familiar routines and known ways of acting. Change interrupts those familiar routines. But change is also an opportunity to stop and reflect on what we are doing and to come to a better understanding of God, who does not change.

Why does the Church change the Liturgy?

In its Liturgy, the Church always attempts to follow the “norm of the holy Fathers.” This effort “requires not only the preservation of what our immediate forebears have handed on to us, but also an understanding and a more profound pondering of the Church’s entire past. . . . this broader view allows us to see how the Holy Spirit endows the People of God with a marvelous fidelity in preserving the unalterable deposit of faith, even though there is a very great variety of prayers and rites” (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, no. 9).

The Liturgy must, therefore, always celebrate and make present the Paschal Sacrifice of Christ—his saving Passion, death, Resurrection, and Ascension. However, over time, it may become necessary to make certain changes, such as adding prayers for recently canonized saints and adding texts that reflect the needs that the People of God wish to bring to God in prayer. The third edition of the *Roman Missal* makes such additions and provides a fresh translation of the Latin texts of the existing content of the *Missal*.

Who decides that the Liturgy should change?

Pope John Paul II approved the promulgation of the third edition of the *Missale Romanum*, the Latin text, on April 20, 2000. The final Latin edition of the revised text was published in March 2002. The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments was responsible for preparing the text. The Congregation is the Vatican office that the pope has charged with overseeing all matters related to the Liturgy and the sacraments. Any changes in the words of the sacramental formulas—the essential words in the celebration of each of the sacraments (either in Latin or in vernacular translations)—must be approved by the Holy Father personally. In addition, church law also gives to conferences of bishops (such as the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) as well as individual bishops certain responsibilities with regard to the Liturgy.

PRAYING THE NEW MISSAL TEXTS

*Presented by the Staff of the Office for Divine Worship
St. Columba Church*

Wednesday, November 9, 2011 7PM to 9PM

You are cordially invited to join the Staff of the Office for Divine Worship for a two hour session of information and reflection on the Third Edition of the Roman Missal. This workshop will explore how the Third Edition of the Roman Missal developed, situating it in the principles of Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, from the Second Vatican Council.

Participants will examine the Order of the Mass, praying the new texts. They will have an opportunity to reflect on the texts as well as an opportunity to sing some of the dialogues and acclamations we will be using when we welcome the new missal on November 27, 2011.

Through study and reflection, prayer and song, participants will be invited to consider how they can go beyond the technical changes in the texts to praying the liturgy with reverence, attention, and lively enthusiasm: using these new texts as the foundation for living the liturgy.

Know the Difference

Halloween, Oct. 31

A traditional secular celebration dating back to pre-Christian Celtic autumn observances, customs and superstitions. Brought to the United States in the 19th century by Irish immigrants, its name is derived from the day on which it is celebrated, All Hallows Eve, the vigil to All Saint's Day.

All Saints' Day, Nov. 1

A holy day of obligation, commemorating all the blessed in heaven. In the fourth century, groups of martyrs, and later other saints, were honored on a common day in various places. In 609 or 610, the Pantheon, a pagan temple in Rome that is still standing, was consecrated as a Christian church in honor of Mary and the martyrs and, later all the saints. In 835, Pope Gregory IV fixed Nov. 1 at the date of the observance.

All Souls' Day, Nov. 2

The annual commemoration of all the faithful departed. The dead were prayed for from the earliest days of the Church. By the sixth century, Benedictine monasteries customarily held commemorations for departed members of Pentecost. In 998, St. Odilio of the Abbey of Cluny fixed the day after All Saints Day as the common commemoration of all the faithful departed. It was approved and recommended by Pope Sylvester II five years later and gradually spread throughout the Christian world, with associated customs and pious traditions.
