Adoring Angels

Some tabernacles in Catholic churches are decorated with images of two angels. Some churches position two statues of angels turned toward the tabernacle in attitude of prayer.

These images indicate a connection between the tabernacle in church and the Old Testament accounts of the Ark of the Covenant. The ark contained the presence of God represented by three important manifestations: the stone tablets on which were written the commandments, the rod of Aaron, and some of the presence of God would remain in their midst. According to Exodus 25:22 images of two angels adorned at the ark.

In Catholic Churches the tabernacle is the place to store the leftover consecrated bread after Mass. This reserved Eucharist is for communion to the sick, for adoration, or for sharing in communion at Mass when an insufficient amount of bread is consecrated.

Jesus called himself the true bread that came down from heaven (Jn 6:58), alluding to the story of the manna. Just as the manna provided sustenance for the Israelites on their wanderings, so Christ, our bread of life, sustains up on our pilgrimage toward heaven. The Israelites kept some manna in a box, and Catholics keep some of the Blessed Sacrament in a box. To draw the connection between the tabernacle and the Ark of the Covenant, many churches adorn the tabernacle or its area with images of adoring angels. They show that God's plan from long ago is realized today. These angels remind believers that Jesus Christ is the presence of God, who takes up a dwelling in our midst.

In Sure and Certain Hope — Preparing a Catholic Funeral

Since November is the month of All Souls, here are some topics concerning the death of a loved one. We hope this helps clarify any uncertainties on these subjects.

Donations of Organs or the Whole Body

Moved by charity, Catholics may donate their bodies or parts of their bodies to advance medical science. The only limitation is that, upon eventual disposition of the body or its parts, there should be some reasonable assurance that the remains will be disposed of in a proper, reverent manner. After organ removal for medical research, whatever remains of the donor's body should be given an appropriate burial.

The family of the donor should celebrate a memorial Mass after the person's death. The rite of committal with Final Commendation may appropriately conclude the prayers for the donor and their family.

Charity Burial

Burial in a Catholic cemetery is available to every Catholic who, at the time of death, is entitled to receive Christian burial. Inability to meet the cemetery costs is no deterrent to Christian burial in a Catholic cemetery. When a family is faced with financial hardship, the parish priest or the funeral director should contact the Resource Consultant at Catholic Charities (312-655-7122). The Resource Consultant will describe the sources of public and private funds available for assistance and recommend the nature and degree of charitable assistance to be given by Catholic Cemeteries.
