Sit

“Why are you sitting around doing nothing?” the owner of the vineyard says to the day laborers in Jesus’s parable. It’s a question — and maybe a bit of an accusation — we can sometimes toss at each other in our families. In fact, it happens. We can sit around and do nothing. But there is another side to sitting.

“Sit up and pay attention. This is really important.” We’ve heard that too. Sitting can mean receiving a message, learning something of value, or letting ourselves be affected by what we see and hear. That’s the sitting that goes on at Mass.

We do sit at Mass, and we are ready to be touched by the Word of God. If we sit up and pay attention, how can we not be affected by the message? You are forgiven. You are loved. You have great gifts and responsibilities. You are connected to each other. You are the object of God’s hope.

Al sentarnos en la misa, nos disponemos a dejarnos tocar por la palabra de Dios. Si nos sentamos y escuchamos con atención, de seguro que nos va a tocar el mensaje. “¡Quedas perdonado!” “¡Dios te ama!” “¡Tú eres muy valioso!” “¡Aviva tu relación con los demás!” “¡Dios espera mucho de ti!”
