I wanted to take some time to talk about some of the amazing things happening at St. Florian. Some of our students have been taking part in celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month (September 15 - October 15). The first and second graders made flags representative of Hispanic countries. The 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> graders have been working on making homemade Pinatas.

On October 2, 2015, Bishop Perry visited St. Florian and spent time talking to the new principal, Crystal Grankowski. Bishop Perry also visited classrooms, where students had prepared questions for him about his ministry in the church. The students really enjoyed the Bishop's visit and were excited he could share time with us.

Middle school students at St. Florian have been utilizing the computer lab for Mathletics, a Common Core based Mathematics program. Students in the middle school have also been working on Story Boards to prove their knowledge of Story Elements. Their teachers are doing a really amazing job to make sure these programs spark student interest and raise their knowledge.

Our primary grade students recently learned about apples. They took a field trip to the orchard to pick apples. There were a lot of interesting projects that coincided with apples, including counting them, graphing them, drawing pictures, and deciding which apple the students enjoyed eating the most.

We hope to continue to bring new and intriguing curriculum/events to our students in the future. We are working on gathering more resources to do so, including going to the toybox connection in Orland.
