The Christmas Custom of Oplatki



Oplatki “The Bread of Love”
Before sitting down at the table, everyone receives a piece of wafer, called oplatki (Oh-pwa-ki). It is similar to the communion wafer but rectangular with religious nativity scenes stamped into it. Each person breaks off a small piece of the other person’s wafer and eats it, while hugging and exchanging good wishes for the coming year. All transgressions are forgiven and family members start over with a clean slate in their relationships with one another. It is still strongly believed that whatever happens on Christmas Eve will impact the upcoming year. Oplatki, called the “bread of love” is mailed to family members who can’t attend Christmas in person.

Advent Symbols

One of the most enduring symbols of the season, the **Advent Wreath** brings together several powerful images:

- The circular wreath reminds us that's God's love for us has no beginning and no end.
- The **evergreen sprigs** often added to the wreath call to mind the eternal life God offers us in Jesus.
- The four **candles** mark the four weeks of Advent. Three candles are **purple**, the color of repentance, reminding us why we need a Savior in the first place. The one **pink** candle is a sign of joy, even in the midst of waiting. As we light another candle each week, **light** increasing dispels darkness, just as the Light of Christ overcomes the darkness of sin and death in our lives.

Advent Calendars mark the passage of time in a concrete way.
