The Presentation

On this day, the fortieth day of Christmastide, we recall the sacrifice given by Mary and Joseph in the Temple of Jerusalem for the first born male in their family, Jesus. He is recognized by the elders, Simeon and Anna, who give thanks for seeing Jesus themselves before they die. Simeon tells Mary that Jesus is destined to be a sign so that the secret thoughts of many may be laid bare. After this they went home to Nazareth. Jesus grew up and God's favor was with him. What are your secret thoughts and thanks?

Saints for Our Time

Two extraordinary men who shaped the church and the world in the 20th century will be canonized by Pope Francis. Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II will be recognized as saints in ceremonies scheduled April 27th, 2014 at Saint Peter's Basilica.

St. John Paul II

Karol Wojtyla was born in 1920, the youngest of three children in Wadowice, Poland. Karol was a brilliant student with a natural facility for languages and a love for music and theater. Eventually, he would learn at least 12 different languages, an asset he would use again and again in the world travels that marked his papacy.

Due to the German occupation of Poland during World War II, Wojtyla had to attend seminary classes held in secret at the Archbishop's residence in Krakow. With his personal history of friendships with Jews, he would become the first pope to pray at a synagogue and at the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem.

At just 58, Cardinal Wojtyla was elected pope in October 1978, a few months after the sudden death of John Paul I. The second longest serving papacy in Church history, Pope John Paul II's tenure sparkles with significant achievements including: Improved relations with Jews, Muslims and Orthodox Christians; a revised and updated *Catechism of the Catholic Church*; fourteen papal encyclicals, including the *On Labor, Faith and Reason* and the *Gospel of Life*; unwavering support for Church teaching on abortion and euthanasia; a renewed effort for evangelization; and staunch advocacy for peace. He was also known for his deep devotion to the Blessed Mother:

Mother of the Church, Prepare us for your Son's coming! Accept us! With our everyday problems, our weakness and deficiencies, our crises, and personal, family and social shortcomings. Do not let us lose goodwill! Do not let us lose sincerity of conscience and uprightness of behavior! With your prayer, obtain justice for us. Safeguard peace in the whole world! Amen.



When my daughters were little, we had a ritual every evening to put away their toys. They'd scurry around, gather up their items, and bring them to me where I knelt beside



the toy box. As they'd bring each beloved plaything, I'd open the lid, and we'd each say, "Good night, block," or "Good night, Noah's ark," and then they'd place that toy in the box. This ritual was a way of helping them wind down while bringing the evening to a close. Endings matter in a family even the end of an ordinary day. They deserve a bit of care. Small endings handled well prepare our children for bigger endings, such as friends moving, getting cut from a team, or losing a loved pet or family member. Pay attention to endings, and give them their due.
