

Jubilee Year of Mercy

What Will Happen?

On December 8, the feast of the Immaculate Conception and the 50th anniversary of the close of the Second Vatican Council, Pope Francis will open a Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica that



remains sealed except during jubilee years. When he crosses the threshold, this door will become a "Door of Mercy." In the weeks that follow, Holy Doors will be opened by cardinals and bishops in basilicas, cathedrals, and shrines all over the world.

Throughout the extraordinary jubilee year, there will also be special events. Here are a few of the plans:

• Missionaries of Mercy

Pope Francis will send out "Missionaries of Mercy," who are priests with the authority to forgive even the most serious sins. Missionaries of Mercy will be a living sign of the Church's compassion for all people. They will bring God's love to those in need of pardon.

• The Gospel of Mercy

We will hear passages from the Gospel of Luke, the Evangelist of Mercy, during weekend liturgies. Luke's Gospel includes many examples of God's mercy, such as the Prodigal Son, the Lost Sheep, the Good Samaritan, the Feeding of the Five Thousand, as well as the healing of people who are sick, blind, deaf, lame, paralyzed, and afflicted with leprosy.

• 24 Hours of Mercy

Pope Francis is asking for "24 Hours for the Lord" in every diocese on the Friday and Saturday preceding the Fourth Week of Lent. During this time, we can encounter the merciful Christ in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. "Let us place the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the center once more in such a way that it will enable people to touch the grandeur of God's mercy with their own hands" (MV, 17).

• Interfaith Dialogue

Pope Francis is calling for deeper dialogue with Judaism and Islam. Through a shared understanding that mercy is "one of God's most important attributes," we can better understand each other and eliminate closed mindedness, disrespect, violence, and discrimination. "I trust that this jubilee year celebrating the mercy of God will foster an encounter with these religions and with other noble religious traditions" (MV, 23).

• Special Celebrations

Throughout the Year of Mercy, there will be celebrations for special groups, including people working at shrines, those in consecrated life, Divine Mercy devotees, children, deacons, priests, teens and young adults, workers and volunteers of mercy, catechists, Marian devotees, the faithful departed, and prisoners.

On November 20, 2016, the feast of Christ the King, Pope Francis will close the Holy Door of Mercy, marking the end of the jubilee year.

Now Is the Time

Who needs ashes? Why fast and prepare on this day? The joys of last year's Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion and Easter are now reduced to dust. These ashes point out our fragility as we await salvation in Christ Jesus. We must start again "to come down where [we] ought to be" ("'Tis the Gift to Be Simple") and prepare the way of the Lord in our lives. Now is the favorable time and the day of our salvation. The Lord, our Divine Bridegroom, lifts us up from our weakness. We hope to enter into grace and to share in his divine life. Are you ready and willing?

Our Lady of Lourdes

On February 11, 1858, at the grotto of Massabielle in Lourdes, France, Bernadette Soubirous saw a lady dressed in blue and white, who called for repentance and for the construction of a chapel. Bernadette saw more visions of her for several months. Once the lady directed Bernadette to dig into the earth, uncovering a spring of water. Later, she announced her identity in the local dialect: "I am the Immaculate Conception." By July the visions stopped, but the church built at the grotto became a place of pilgrimage, and Bernadette has been declared a saint. Pope Pious IX had declared in December 1854 that Mary the mother of Jesus was "the Immaculate Conception"- just three years before the first apparition in Lourdes. According to this dogma, Catholics believe that Mary was conceived without original sin, that God had prepared her by a special miracle from the moment of her conception to become the mother of Jesus. Sinless throughout her life, Mary became a model and intercessor for Christians. Pilgrimages to Lourdes grew especially popular after sick people reported miraculous cures. Visitors today may prayerfully bathe in the spring that arose during the period of the apparitions. Believers fill containers with this water for private devotion. On the liturgical calendar, February 11 is an optional memorial, which means that a local community may choose whether or not to observe Our Lady of Lourdes at the daily Mass. The collect from the missal asks God that we may "rise up from our iniquities," which echos the lady's call to repentance. It affirms that God is "protection in our weakness," which suggests that the sick can find help. And it calls Mary "the Immaculate Mother of God," a title that blends her proclamation to Bernadette with the faith of the church.
