Miraculous Medal

The miraculous medal is a devotional article adopted by many Catholics around the world. The medal is worn on a ribbon around the neck to assist in the practice of prayer.

Saint Catherine Labouré had just begun her life in the Parisian religious community of the Daughters of Charity in 1830 when she saw a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary proclaiming her care for the world and her desire to help those in need.

The design of the medal comes directly from Catherine's vision. On the front is an image of Mary, standing atop a partially visible globe and crushing the head of a serpent. (Genesis 3:15 says that a woman - or her offspring - would crush the head of the tempter.) Rays of light stream from Mary's fingers, symbols of the grace she channels for believers. Along the oval border stand the words, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." Thus the image affirms the belief that Mary was preserved from sin throughout her entire life, from the moment she was conceived in her mother's womb. The church celebrates the Immaculate Conception each December 8.

On the reverse is the letter M, over which stands a cross resting on a bar that weaves through the letter. Twelve stars surround the image, rescaling the prophetic vision of Revelation 12:1. Near the bottom are two suffering hearts, one wrapped with thorns, signifying the heart of Christ, and the other penetrated by a sword, recalling a prophecy from Luke 2:35, representing Mary.

Many people testify that some who put on the medal experience miraculous cures. Anyone who wears it may be-come more attentive to the favors God grants at the inter-cession of the Blessed Mother.

To **pledge** is to promise. And at the heart of the sacrament of Marriage are promises made and promises kept. Notice, however, that there is something very special

Now we know how fragile our human pledges and promises can be. In the sacrament of Marriage, when a couple pledges themselves to each other, they wrap that promise in faith in God who will sustain the union and keep them faithful. Human pledges and promises are full of risks and unknowns. What makes them real and possible is a love that is more than human. It is God's sustaining love.
