Year of Sacraments • One Word at a Time

Create

To **create** in a strict philosophical and theological sense means to make something out of nothing. And that is true but incomplete. God made the world out of nothing, as the opening chapters of the Book of Genesis clearly state. There is another side to creation, however, that is not the province of philosophers but of poets. Dante Alighieri in the *Divine Comedy* wrote about the love that made the stars. Creation happens because of love.

Marriage, of course, is ordered toward the creation of new life. Spouses cooperate with the Creator, and the result is new life in this world. And be clear about this—the new life that comes from the marital union of a man and a woman is not merely the product of a biological process. It begins and ends in love, human love, certainly, and—even more certainly—divine love.



Crear

Crear en un sentido estrictamente filosófico y teológico significa hacer algo de la nada. Lo cual es la verdad pero incompleta. Dios hizo el mundo de la nada, como claramente afirman los capítulos iniciales del Libro de Génesis. Hay otro aspecto de la creación, sin embargo, que no es materia de los filósofos sino de los poetas. Dante Alighieri en su *Divina Comedia* escribió sobre

el amor que hizo las estrellas. La creación sucede gracias al amor.

El matrimonio, por supuesto, está orientado hacia la creación de nueva vida. Los esposos colaboran con el Creador y el resultado es nueva vida en el mundo. Y debemos dejar en claro esto: la nueva vida que proviene de la unión marital de un hombre y una mujer no es meramente el producto de un proceso biológico. Comienza y termina en el amor, amor humano, ciertamente, e, incluso con mayor certeza, amor divino.
