Individual Christians are never meant to be closed in on themselves. Jesus says, "Love one another as I have loved you." In effect, the disciples of Jesus live lives open to others. The same is true for Christian families built on the foundations of the sacrament of Marriage. These families, if they are to be true to their Christian identity, are centers of hospitality. They **take in** others. They receive them and support them. They make a space, especially for those who are most in need.

Taking in others and caring for them, of course, does not mean that families are disrupted or meant to be without their own integrity. It does mean that every family has a mission that it must discover. This mission is to be a receiving presence in this world, whether that is in a soup kitchen or through adoption or more direct care of relatives in need. In every case, the Christian family lives beyond itself.

Acoger

Los individuos cristianos nunca son creados para encerrarse en sí mismos. Jesús dice: "Que se amen unos a otros como yo los he amado". En efecto, los discípulos de Jesús viven una vida abierta a los demás. Lo mismo es verdad para las familias cristianas que se construyen sobre

los cimientos del matrimonio sacramental. Estas familias, si son fieles a su identidad cristiana, son centros de hospitalidad. **Acogen** a los demás. Los reciben y los apoyan. Hacen un lugar, especialmente para aquellos que tienen mayor necesidad.

Acoger a otros y ocuparse de ellos, por supuesto, no quiere decir que las familias deban alterarse o perder su integridad. Quiere decir que cada familia tiene una misión que debe descubrir. Esta misión es ser una presencia receptiva en el mundo, sea esto en un comedor de beneficencia, en la adopción o en el cuidado directo de un familiar necesitado. En todos los casos, la familia cristiana vive más allá de sí misma.
