KNOW THE MASS, ONE WORD AT A TIME

Unite

The Mass unites us and makes us one but not in the ways that you might expect. You may not know the name or history of the person sitting next to you in the pew. Still, the Mass unites you

and draws you extraordinarily close to each other. How does this happen?

We are first united in Holy Communion with Jesus and in the unity of the Holy Spirit with each other. Saint Paul said, "Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake the one bread" (1 Corinthians 10:17). The Mass, then, unites us with Jesus and, in him, with each other. That is a gift. Besides being a gift, this unity is also a task and a responsibility that flows from the Mass, as we hear Paul urging us to make "every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit" (Ephesians 4:3). Finally, this unity is our hope and destiny, as Jesus prayed for us: "The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one" (John 17:22-23).

La Misa nos une y nos hace uno, pero no de la manera que Usted pudiera esperar. Quizá no conozca ni siquiera el nombre ni la historia de la persona sentada a su lado, o en la banca siguiente; sin embargo,

la Misa les une y los acerca, el uno al otro, de modo extraordinario. ¿Cómo es esto?

Además de ser un don, esta unidad es también una tarea y una responsabilidad que fluye de la Misa, como escuchamos a Pablo urgirnos: "esfuércense por mantener la unidad del espíritu con el vínculo de la paz" (Efesios 4:3). Por último, esta unidad es nuestra esperanza y destino, como Jesús ha orado por nosotros: "Yo les di la gloria que tú me diste para que sean uno como lo somos nosotros. Yo en ellos y tú en mí, para que sean plenamente uno (Juan 17: 22-23).

Beginning April 21, 2013, our church will be participating in the Baby Bottle Project benefiting the Women's Centers of Greater Chicagoland. This non-profit organization directly assists mothers and families experiencing crisis pregnancies by offering emotional, financial, material, and spiritual support through counseling, clothing & monetary provisions, prayer and other aid. Each year the three locations together have over 5,000 appointments with expecting mothers. By God's Grace, the Women's Centers have saved over 36,000 babies—and their mothers—from abortion since opening in 1984.

This is a simple, but crucial fundraising effort for the Women's Centers. Please note the Baby Bottles cost almost \$1.00 per bottle and are recycled afterwards so please return upon completion of the project. 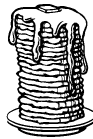
