Persons with Disabilities

The sacraments of the Catholic Church are open to persons with disabilities. The United States conference of Catholic Bishops supports this practice in it's *Guidelines for the Celebration of the Sacraments with Persons with Disabilities*.

A disability is never a reason for deferring baptism. Unbaptized adults or children of catechetical age should receive formation according to their understanding. After initiation, those with disabilities may serve as sponsors.

People baptized as infants may be confirmed in the United States between the age of discretion and age 18, depending on the diocesan policy. Persons who never attained the use of reason because of mental disabilities may receive confirmation at the appropriate time.

To receive communion, a person should be able to distinguish it from ordinary food. If ministers are in doubt, their decision should favor the rights of the baptized. A mental disability does not automatically disqualify a person from holy Communion.

The sacrament of reconciliation is open to all those who have a sense of sin, even if they do not have full use of reason. Those who are hearing impaired have a right to confess to a priest who knows sign language, to use an interpreter who must keep the confession secret, or to write their sins for a priest to read.

A disability is not necessarily an illness. Those with disabilities receive the anointing of the sick under the same criteria as other Catholics.

A physical disability does not necessarily disqualify a person from holy orders. However, to be anointed –or to be married– does require the use of reason.

Persons who are hearing impaired may be married using sign language or an interpreter. Some persons with disabilities can be effective in preparing others for marriage and other sacraments.
