Dear Parishioners of St. Florian,

In response to a number of concerns brought forward regarding the behavior of youths resident at Aunt Martha's, I arranged a meeting that took place Thursday, July 17, with your pastor Father Robert Marchwiany and two officials of the youth hostel.

It proved a very productive meeting. These two officials recently come aboard had a genuine grasp of the problem and pledged that corrections are in motion with the following steps:

- 1) The program manager at Aunt Martha's has been suspended and a new manager will be assigned shortly. Other staff supervision improvements are taking place as we speak.
- 2) One of the officials gave Fr. Marchwiany his cell number where he can be reached nearby should anything arise needing attention.
- 3) Father Marchwiany will form a small group of parishioners who will meet periodically with officials of Aunt Martha's to keep the lines of communication going, express any concerns and discuss how together we can move forward welcoming a good work with troubled kids.
- 4) Soon to be implemented, staff uniforms with logo so that neighbors can visibly see supervisory adult persons amidst the youth. The facility situates one supervisory adult per three youths.

Aunt Martha's has a long tenant relationship with the Archdiocese of Chicago, leasing facilities in this Vicariate at St. Florian-Chicago, St. Irenaeus-Park Forest and St. Mary Queen of Apostles-Riverdale. This is one reason why a meeting like this was called for at this point. If replies of house-staff have not been adequate these senior officials pledge differently moving forward.

The Church has a long history with child-welfare. Two examples immediately come to mind, St. John Bosco who worked with Italian youth in the 19th century and whose model of working with deprived Italian boys spread throughout the world. Closer to home, there is the famous Father Edward Flanagan, who founded "*Boys Town*" at Omaha Nebraska in 1917. Hollywood made the famous movie in 1938 about this heroic priest and his work with troubled youth. Father Flanagan had a dream that every child could be a productive citizen if given love, a home, an education and a trade. He accepted boys of every race, color and creed. He firmly believed, "There are no bad boys. There is only bad environment, bad training, bad example, bad thinking."

Similarly, in our neighborhood, the division of Child and Family Services (DCFS) leases the former convent a residential facility for troubled youth who are wards of the State of Illinois. These are kids who have been abused and neglected. Being deprived, as all deprived kids do, sometimes they emotionally act out, do unacceptable things to draw attention or in some instances shout out their anguish and hurt. The results that issue forth from human neglect have not changed over the many years, only the faces of the children.

By law enacted in this state, officials assigned to these wards are not permitted to physically restrain a young person, save only in instances of danger to life and limb.

I thank you for your patience and for bringing us your concerns.
